A trip to become acquainted with the culture of the people of Pehuén, sharing with them the place they use as veranadas and where they have developed touristic activities to show their experiences, told so that the visitor can be enriched and know more about the life and history of this group which lives near Lonquimay.

Along with this you will take a trip through one of the pewenches tracks that exist in this place until arriving at the location where the trekking of Navidad Crater will start, with impressive views of the mountain range in this zone. This cone appeared in the last eruption of the Lonquimay volcano on December 25, 1988. The aforementioned volcano is one of the seven that we will discover in this dazzling voyage through the mythic land of the Mapuche – Pewenche people.

The guides that will accompany us have interesting information about the rich volcanic history of the Los Andes de la Araucanía, a journey that will take us from the majestic Icalma and Galletué lakes, passing through 1,000-year-old Araucaria forests and sharing with two indigenous communities, Melipeuco and Lonquimay, and one of the 7 volcanoes that we will discover in this dazzling voyage through the mythic land of the Mapuche.
